## **Code of Practice for junior coaches and members (Summary)**

The Code of Practice provides guidance for members to promote **high standards**, **safety**, **fairness**, **and enjoyment** in angling. Everyone involved shares responsibility for creating positive experiences and supporting participant development.

# **Key Principles**

### 1. Rights

- Respect every individual's right to participate in angling.
- o Provide an inclusive, safe, and harassment-free environment.
- o Treat all participants fairly and without discrimination.

### 2. Relationships

- o Build relationships based on trust, honesty, and respect.
- o Never engage in any form of abuse or inappropriate behaviour.
- o Follow safeguarding procedures and report concerns.
- o Empower anglers to make their own decisions and respect confidentiality.

#### 3. Personal Standards

- o Act as positive role models through fairness, honesty, and professionalism.
- o Maintain high standards of conduct, language, and appearance.
- Avoid drugs, alcohol, or smoking while coaching.
- o Promote the values and spirit of angling.

### 4. Professional Standards

- o Provide safe, well-planned, and appropriate coaching.
- o Maintain proper qualifications and commit to ongoing training.
- Work with integrity, accept responsibility, and support good practice.
- Contribute to the wider development of angling and the coaching profession.
