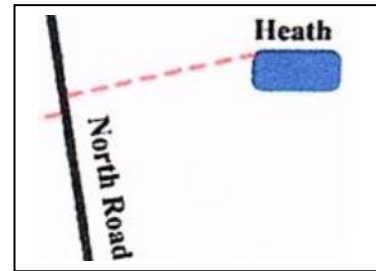


**Directions:-**

From A57 turn up Arundel street, go under railway bridge, turn left onto North road. Proceed up North road, through the cross roads until you reach a stretch with no buildings on left hand side, the Gate/path for access to lodge is on right hand side. Go through gate and follow path until end, turn right and follow path to lodge. You will need the code to the gate lock.



**Fish stock:-**

**Carp, Tench, Bream, Roach and Perch**

**Baits, Tips and Tactics:-**

If fishing for Roach and Perch the same tactics as top and bottom pond work great but, I would fish for them just off any Lilly pads around the pond, just as the shelf drops off to approximately 5 Foot in depth and fish full depth, or slightly over. Bream will fall to anything from luncheon meat ( hair rigged or directly to hook) to double maggots, to wafers/ boilies. Carp are used to seeing Wafers, boilies, Dead maggots, Cheese paste, Bread paste Corn, mainly traditional baits, but with some modern styles mixed in. I have very successfully fished on the float and even float fishing towards the middle of the pond but, Bomb fishing, feeder fishing (both cage and method) are all successful tactics, as is floating bread and dog biscuits. Hemp and tares work just as good on carp, as they do on the smaller fish.

Personally, I would fish just off the Lillys (any of them) 4 foot from any bank (margins) as we have carp that cruise and carp that patrol the margins and I have caught in both locations. If targeting Tench, either fish the deep trench, 6Ft, that runs from the outlet to the boards on the far side of the pond, or the Lillys that are in the corner far corner as you enter the pond, Tench city as it is called.

Yet again, this is a traditional water and I am not convinced that ground bait actually gives anyone an advantage.
