Policy Statement

GAAS is committed to doing all that is reasonably practicable to prevent injury and damage to property, and to safeguard everyone involved in or affected by our activities.

1. Duty of Care

Members must act responsibly and ensure their actions or omissions do not create foreseeable risks of harm to others.

2. Risk Assessments

- The Club will carry out suitable risk assessments for all activities and events.
- Hazards and risks will be identified, and appropriate control measures implemented.
- Assessments aim to reduce the likelihood of accidents and promote the health, safety, and welfare of all participants.

3. Responsibilities

Committee:

- Ensure the policy is followed and risk assessments are completed when necessary.
- Brief participants and allocate resources effectively and safely.

Committee & Members:

- Plan, manage, and supervise activities safely.
- Maintain clear communication, proper delegation and carry out duties safely and responsibly.

4. Working with Young People

 All members must comply with the Societies (Duty Of Care For Junior Anglers Policy). • Adequate supervision ratios will be maintained:

5. Incident Reporting

- All injuries (beyond minor cuts) must be recorded on an **Accident Form**, signed by both the injured person and the responsible person.
- Serious incidents must receive prompt medical attention and be reported as required.
